SAILING TOWARD SUCCESS



English Language Arts: We completed the English Language Arts standardized testing (MCAS). Students are reading Lois Lowry's, The Giver in literature circles. Students are enjoying the book groups. Students finished writing their DARE essays and are and we are working on Country Reports.



All first drafts of the country report have been returned to students. Your child should be making corrections and finalizing his/her report. **Please check in with your child** to make sure. We are continuing to work on culture in school. Final Country reports are due MAY 23. Triboards are due May 26, 2017.

Science: We are learning about the Changing Earth, tectonic plate movements, waves, earthquakes and volcanoes. Look for a project assignment soon!

Writing: Using the Lucy Caulkin's method of writing we are writing informational culture essays to include in our Country Reports.

Math: We completed the standardized tests for math this week. Students have been immersed in Geometry. Students can find area, volume, surface area and other useful information about common shapes we use in everyday life. They are prepared to help determine how much wood is needed to build a deck. Students can work with a carpenter and explain how to purchase wood by finding the area of triangles and rectangles. Students can identify nets and determine the surface area of shapes. We reviewed percents, fractions, decimals, ratios, proportions, standard algorithms, divided and multiplied with decimals and fractions. We reviewed divisibility rules and greatest common factors and least common multiples. We plotted on coordinate planes.

Social Studies: We are investigating the five themes of Geography. We completed our study of Europe and are currently studying Africa and Northwest Asia. We are reading current events and reporting back on what we learn.

Technology: We use Google Classroom every day. We create, share and group share our work. We use our chromebooks for research, writing and math. We have learned new tools this year. We are increasing our technology skills every day.
