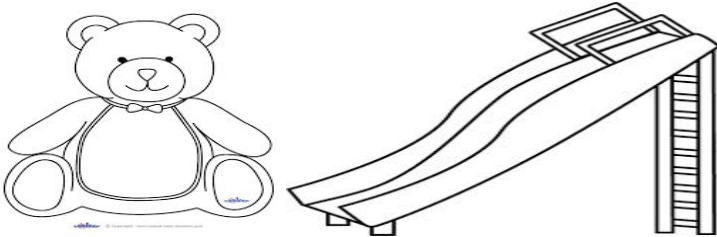
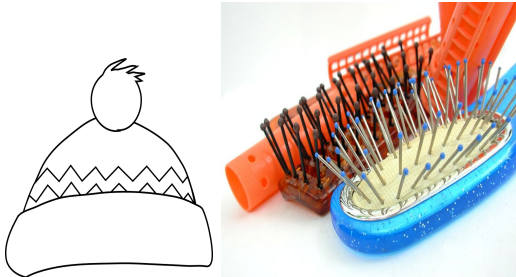

Anyone can get head lice...

mainly through direct head-to-head contact but also from sharing hats, brushes and other personal items.
